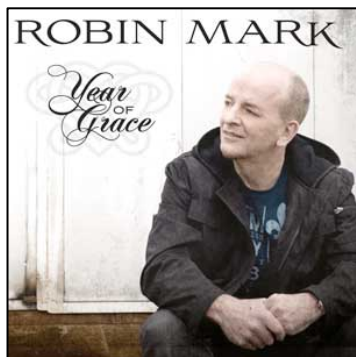


Rev. Dr. Leonard Sweet

Professor of Evangelism, Drew University
Author & Futurist

Rev. Dr. Leonard Sweet is an author, preacher, scholar, and ordained United Methodist clergyman currently serving as the E. Stanley Jones Professor of Evangelism at Drew Theological School, in Madison, New Jersey; and a Visiting Distinguished Professor at George Fox University in Portland, Oregon. He is regularly voted one of the most influential Christian leaders in America.

He is the author of more than forty books, hundreds of articles (many of a scholarly and technical nature), and over 50 prefaces/forewords to others' books. He has over 1000 published sermons, and currently is the chief weekly contributor to the lectionary-based sermons.com. Sweet has weekly podcasting on iTunes entitled Napkin Scribbles.

He has worked with First Nations people in the North and served as chaplain at the Canadian Forces Northern Area Headquarters (now Joint Task Force North) in Yellowknife.
